#### It's Our World - TRAIL 2014

TRAIL has joined forces with over 20 *It's Our World* partners to help create the UK's biggest ever Online Art Gallery celebrating the environment, as seen through

the eyes of its future custodians (aged 4-19 years).

*It's Our World,* a national arts project to promote sustainability through art, will be promoted by TRAIL during this year's 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary sculpture trail.

From 18<sup>th</sup> July until end of August, the seafront at Teignmouth will play host to artworks created from recycled materials by artists, local schools and community groups

The young people's artworks will be amongst the very first to be uploaded onto the *It's Our World* Online Gallery that officially opens in September. Closing date for submissions is end of May for nationwide display from UN World Environment Day 5<sup>th</sup> June 2015. The entire collection will be handed over to the British Library's UK Web Archives, providing a lasting snapshot of how children and young people across the nation view their world.

Mostly driven through schools and selected partners, participants across the UK, are invited to bring their local landscape, coastline or neighbourhood to life by creating an artwork to celebrate where they live. Subject matter can range from close up studies of natural forms to sweeping landscapes and can be approached in any way including painting, drawing, photography.

The use of recycled and natural materials is especially encouraged which is why TRAIL were one of the first organisations to be contacted. The ultimate aim behind *It's Our World* is to encourage children and young people to take the lead in living more sustainably by reducing waste, saving energy and water.

TRAIL is amongst a growing list of over 20 arts, educational and environmental groups involved including Start, the sustainability initiative of Business in the Community one of The Prince's charities, Healthy Planet, The Wildlife Trusts, The Eden Project, Keep Britain Tidy and The Campaign for Drawing to name but a few. Artworks from previous sculpture trails were featured on Europe's biggest indoor ad screen JCDecaux's Motion@Waterloo to launch *It's Our World* on 5<sup>th</sup> June UN World Environment Day.

The project's Celebrity Patrons include Astronaut Commander Col Chris Hadfield, Stephen Fry, Simon King, Fearne Cotton, Ben Fogle, Liz Bonnin, Sir Tim Smit Co-Founder of The Eden Project and Michael Morpurgo who stated "This is an inspired idea for it will open young minds and eyes to the world about them. Anything that does that is powerful for them and powerful for the planet"


